



2023 ANNUAL REPORT

FORWARD

As I write this Serve the City Peninsula has just passed its 7th year of spreading kindness on the Peninsula. It is incredible to look back on what has happened since 160 volunteers came out on a Saturday in March 2017 to work on 7 projects in and around Newport Harbor Apartments in Newport News with just \$1,600 in donations.



Since then, almost 8,000 volunteers have worked on close to 800 projects for a total of over 25,000 volunteer-hours. And our donors and funders have contributed over \$300,000 in funds, goods, and services.

With these resources, volunteers have helped 97 elderly households to stay safe, warm, and dry in their homes and have helped to restore hope and pride in their neighborhood. They have played hundreds of hours of BINGO with seniors who have no other social outlet. They have delivered over 15 tons of food to those living with food insecurity and helped to raise fresh produce for those living in a food desert. They have packed thousands of care and hygiene kits for victims of abuse and the homeless, and delivered hundreds of beds for children with no bed of their own.

They have done all this and so much more to bring hope and compassion to those who are often unseen and forgotten, showing respect for those who society overlooks, and serving with humility, courage, and love in all that they have done. No matter how small or insignificant the task, no matter how menial the job, these volunteers have stepped up and said, 'kindness starts with me'.

Together, these volunteers and our donors and funders have contributed over one million dollars of value in raising the kindness quotient of the Peninsula. And that is what has made Serve the City Peninsula a "success" in the eyes of the community and our dozens of partners. We, the collective we, are not impactful in the community because of our staff or programs – we are impactful because of those who volunteer their time and resources, even when it's wet or cold or inconvenient.









